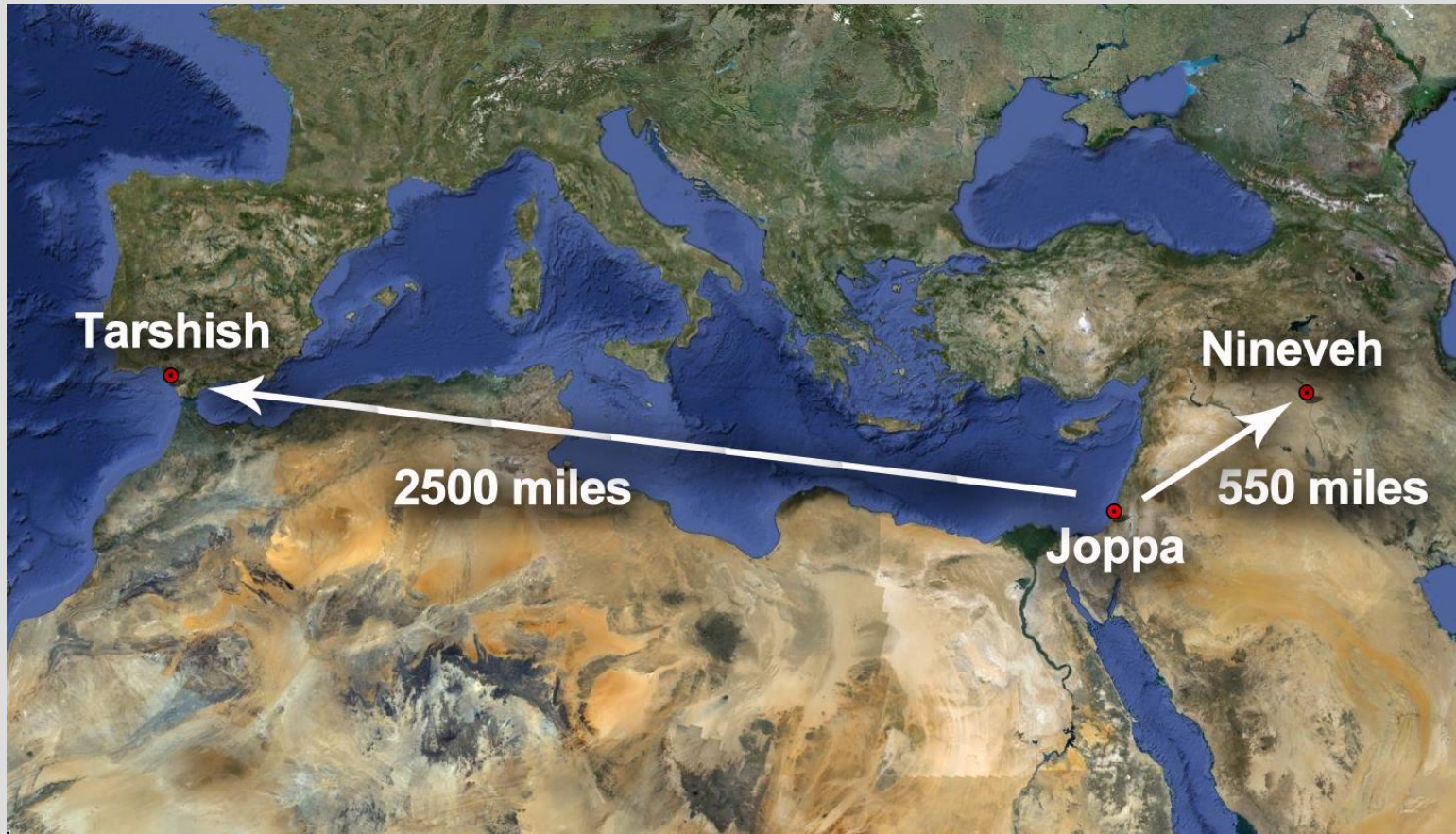

DIGGING A LITTLE DEEPER...

What is sin?

“Sin is any failure to conform to the moral law of God in act, attitude, or nature.”

Wayne Grudem, Systematic Theology, (Grand Rapids: Zondervan: 1994), 490.

**When we sin, we are being
disobedient and rebellious.**

JONAH'S REBELLION

I) Jonah wants to be the judge (4:1)

- A. Jonah wants to determine how people should respond.
- B. Jonah wants to determine who is worthy of mercy.

APPLICATION

**Remember that
only God is judge.**

JONAH'S REBELLION

1) *Jonah wants to be the judge (4:1)*

2) **Jonah wants to be the ruler**

A. Throw me into the sea (1:12)

B. Jonah leaves for Tarshish to prevent Ninevite repentance (1:3; 4:2)

C. Take my life from me (4:3)

APPLICATION

**Remember that
only God is ruler.**
